

OCMC Participates in Ohio Chamber of Commerce Public Affairs Meeting

On March 1, 2016, **Ohio Constitutional Modernization Commission** members Chad A. Readler, Representative Michael F. Curtin and Executive Director Steven C. Hollon participated in the Ohio Chamber of Commerce's Public Affairs meeting.

The Chamber's Public Affairs meeting occurs during election years to monitor and evaluate public affairs issues and activities when of interest to the business community and to examine proposed state constitutional amendments or initiative petition efforts that affect the electoral process.

Readler, chair of the Education, Public Institutions, and Local Government Committee gave an update on his committee in regards to the decision to retain the thorough and

efficient provision that can be found in Article VI, Section 2 (School Funds) of the Ohio Constitution. As well, Readler provided an update regarding the Constitutional Revisions and Updating Committee's work on the initiative and referendum processes.

Representative Michael F. Curtin, a member of the Legislative Branch and Executive Branch Committee, spoke on redistricting and its effect on Ohio and Franklin County.

Executive Director Hollon led the panel by giving a brief overview of the commission, its works, and its mission.
